John H. Word 53

John H. Word, merchant, Bowdon, Carroll County, Georgia, son of John Bryson and Amelia (Sparks) Word, was born in Carroll County in 1836. His father came to Georgia when a young man and settled in Franklin and was one of the first school teachers in Heard County, where he taught for several years. Students came as many as seven miles to his school. He moved to Carroll County, Georgia, in 1836, where he settled on a farm and soon rose to considerable prominance. He was elected the justice of the inferior court and the justice of the peace. For many years he was deacon in the Baptist Church.

John H. Word was reared on his father's farm and made this his home until he married. In 1861, while a student at Bowdon College, he enlisted in Company B (commanded by Captain Charles A. McDaniel) of Cobb's Legion and participated in many hard-fought battles, among them being Dam No. 1, Yorktown, Seven Days' fight around Richmond, and Malvern Hill. He went to Maryland but was too late for the second battle of Manassas. He was at the battle of South Mountain, September 14, 1862, where he lost his left leg, a month elapsing before it was amputated, and was taken prisoner in this condition. Only four of his company escaped 1 death or wounds. Following an attack of smallpox, he was struck by lightning and had to submit to a second amputation. In 1863 he returned home to Bowdon, Georgia. He immediately went into the general merchandising business in Bowdon but some Federal troops came by and broke him up. In 1863 he was elected Clerk of the Superior Court and served for two years and was made a notary public and filled that office in Bowdon for six years. In 1884 he was elected to represent Carroll County in the General Assembly of Georgia. In 1893 he was elected county commissioner of Carroll County and took an active part in the building of the new courthouse.

In 1866 he was married to Miss Virginia Colquitt, daughter of William and Ann (Stringer) Colquitt. Her father was a soldier in the Confederate Army and part of the time a guard at the Andersonville prison. When they began keeping house, they were in a destitute condition, but by hard work, honest living, and good management, they became prosperous. They were devout members of the Baptist Church, and were always liberal contributors to all worthy causes.

John H. Word was a trustee of Bowdon College for more than thirty years and treasurer of the board for ten years. Like the Colquitts, he was a liberal contributor to all worthy causes but more especially when the needs of Bowdon College were concerned. He never turned a deaf ear to its needs. He lived to a ripe old age and is buried beside his wife in the Bowdon Cemetery.

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THREE BARROW BROTHERS SON of Res. James BARROW. Civil War information Was 17 years old when he

JAMES R. BARROW - Born 3 Oct. 1844 at Bowdon, Carroll County, Ga. was the third of these three Barrow brothers to enlist in the CSA.

He volunteered for service in Cobb's Legion, Georgia Volunteers at Bowdon, Carroll County, Georgia on 30 July 1862, "for the period of war" and was assigned, as a private, to Co. B of Cobb's Legion, Infantry Battallion. (the same Co. his brother William H. C. was in). His Civil War records are scant, as most of them are, but they do show that he was wounded at the battle of South Mountain (or Commiss (?) Gap), Md. on 14 Sept. 1862. "He was wounded in the foot and ankle and same was amputated below the knee".

The following are "cards" in his Cival War record at Georgia Archives, Atlanta, Ga.:

- 6. Not dated. Register of Payments; For March 1, 1863 to Aug 31, 1863. \$75.58 paid 30, Oct. 1863. Remarks: Clothing fund.
- 7. Muster Roll Card dated 1 Jan. 1864. Remarks; On furlough, Leg amputated.
- 8. Dated 22 April 1864. Paid for 1 Sept. 1863 to 21 Feb. 1864. Pay \$66.00, Clothing \$134.13 Total paid \$200.13. This was received by and signed for, at Atlanta, Ga. 21 April, 1864. He signed his name Jas. R. Barrow.
- 9. Muster Roll card dated 19 Dec. 1864. Remarks: Wounded & on furlough, Leg amputated.

 James R. Barrow probably was wounded and captured in the battle for Harpore Forry. Md.

 when General Lee invaded Maryland in Sept. 1862 and again confronted Union General

 McClellan who, by a stroke of luck, had a copy of Lee's orders to his commanding officers which had been found by a Union soldier urapped around three cigars at an abandoned Confederate campsite on 13 Sept. 1862. This battle, along with Sharpsburg, Md. was one of the bloodest of the war. 11,500 Union and 9,000 Confederate soldiers were killed or wounded in this battle.

James must have been one of the "lucky" wounded because, from all indications, he was well cared for at the Union hospital's he was in before being "paroled" to the Confederate Gen. Hospital at Pettersburg, Va., arriving there 4 Dec. 1862, which was about $2\frac{1}{2}$ month's after his leg was amputated.

Just when or how he got from the hospital in Pettersburg, Va. is not known. He did

receive "Pay and Clothing" at Atlanta, Ga. on 21 April 1864 and this may be the time he arrived back in Georgia.

On 8 Dec. 1879, James R. Barrow, at Carrollton, Carroll County, Ga. applied for "Money to buy myself an Artifical Leg". He was given \$75.00 to buy same" on 16 Dec. 1879. (as of May 1986, it is not known by me, if he already had an artifical leg or was using crutches pryor to that time.) (HMC)


