GUILLAUME TRAILLOUR and his wife JEANNE MICHEAU of Ponthieu, who moved to Flanders prior to Guillaume's death in 1308 were parents of—

GUILLAUME TRAILLOUR, who married JEANNE DUDEVANT, and died in 1327. Their son—

JEAN TRAILLEUR, born 1322, married 1357 MARIE PASCAL, dau. of NICHOLAS PASCAL and ADELAIDE, and lived in Cambria. Their son was—

RAOL TRAILLEUR of Bavia, husband of MARGUERITE CAMBERNOUX of Bavia, where they married 1425. Their son—

GUILLAUME TRAILLEUR of Montherme, born about 1425, married MARGUERITE BASCOM July 14, 1471. Their son—

JEAN TRAILLOUR of Maubeuge and of le Cateau, born 1472, married July 3, 1493 ANNE BROQUIN and lived in Holland. Their son—

EDOUARD TRAILLOUR, born Jan. 8, 1495 lived at Maubeuge, married MARIE DE LA RONDE Aug. 4, 1529. Their son—

NOEL TRAILLOUR, born June 19, 1540, married JEANNE DE GASQUE of Nouzon Sept. 3, 1562. He died at Nouzon Aug. 3, 1579, having married 2nd MARIE DANIEL, dau. of ANTOINE DANIEL and MARIE DUDEVANT. Their son—

JEAN TRAILLOUR, born 1563, emigrated to London and married BARBE DU FOY in the Walloon or Strangers' Church in Canterbury, England. He returned to France in 1610. Their son was—

EDOUARD TRAILLOUR, born in London, England, 1596, married LOUISE PASCAL in France Feb. 6, 1638, dau. GUILLAUME and MARIE TRAVERS PASCAL of Nouzon, France. Edouard died

intestate on Jan. 4, 1672, aged 76 years. His widow appeared in court and made a deposition on May 11, 1672, listing the following children:

Marie, born Feb. 9, 1642, married PHILLIP TURPIN of Meziers Aug. 19, 1660; issue Thomas Turpin, born June 11, 1662, family emigrated to Henrico Co., Va. where land grants are of record April 1705.

Pascal, born April 7, 1643, married SUZANNE EPPES, dau. GUILLAUME and MARIE BOUGHER EPPES of Croiset, Pas de Calais, France, Oct. 3, 1676.

Joseph, born June 16, 1644, emigrated to London, was naturalized in 1692, with his wife MARY ARCHER, but returned to Nouzon, France in 1703.

Blanche, born Sept. 4, 1647 and emigrated to England.

EDOUARD TRAILLOUR (EDWARD TRAYLOR), above, born at Nouzon in the Ardennes, France, May 7, 1639 married MARTHA RANDOLF at Hampton Parish, England, in 1660. They emigrated to America in 1663, settled in Henrico Co., Va. He died in 1678. She married second JOHN PORTER, and died in Henrico Co., in 1725, signing her will "Martha Traylor Porter." Children of Edward Traylor and Martha Randolph (or Randolph) were:

Edward (Jr.) born Eng. ca. 1670

Hildreth (daughter) birthdate unknown

William born Eng. ca. 1674

Martha Randolph was the daughter of Richard Randolph or Randolph, and Elizabeth Ryland, was born about 1640 in Warwick, England, and made a will 4/15/1725, probated 4/4/1726 in Henrico Co., Va. Her second husband, John Porter, had predeceased her. Witness to Martha Porter's will was JOHN TRAYLOR; was he John, the son of William Traylor, grandson of Martha? Another note of interest—Sole heir under Martha Porter's will was to be WILLIAM TRAYLOR, her son, who was also appointed to be the executor. No mention in the will of either Edward, Jr., or dau. Hildreth, Mrs. William Hankins. Had elder son, Edward, already received the bulk of the estate? I do not know. This point should be researched. We do know that he was alive when Martha's will was made and probated, as was Hildreth Hankins.

WILLIAM HANKINS married HILDRETH TRAYLOR, dau. of Edward Traylor and Martha Randolph. No more information on this couple is known.

SEPARATION OF TRAYLOR LINES BEGINS HERE

The two sons, William and Edward Traylor, form a natural separation in this presentation of the Traylor family's history. We must take up the descendants of each son separately in order to avoid confusion for many given names are repeated in both lines!

EDWARD TRAYLOR was the son of Edward Traylor and Martha Randolph, and presumably the eldest son. He was born in England about 1679, came with his parents to Henrico Co., Va. and about 1700 married ELIZABETH PERKINSON, dau. of SETH PERKINSON of Henrico Co.

Some confusion has arisen about whether Edward was married one or two times; the Bristol Parish Register has conflicting entries. The Bristol register noted that Mary Traylor was the mother of son William (1733), while dau. Phoebe and Blanch were children of wife Elizabeth Traylor. Edward's will also named his wife as Elizabeth Traylor, so we must assume that the entry of the mother of William was in error, not that a wife Mary appeared between two wives Elizabeth!

The Henrico Co. Order Book 1737-46, p. 369 contains the will of Edward, signed in 1745, and probated at May Court 1746 with Thomas Ellis as Executor, and proved by oath of Peter Worsham.

William Traylor served in the Revolution in the 5th Continental Line of Virginia, was enumerated with "8 white souls" in Halifax Co., Va. in 1785. Previously he was living in Dinwiddie Co. in 1780 when he purchased land in Halifax Co. From Virginia William Traylor and his family moved quickly into Wilkes County, Ga., and here he received land grants on Long Creek, later cut off into Oglethorpe County, Ga. By 1786 he was already settled in, and in 1787 he sold his Halifax Co. land to John Salmon. Some land in Henrico Co., Va., which William owned he sold to Richard Bradshaw in 1788.

William Traylor died intestate and his estate was administered by Thomas Traylor (probably his brother), who was appointed administrator by the court Aug. 7, 1791, with Boswell Bridges security. Appraisers were W. Strother, Thomas Kennerly, James Hays, who returned a list of household goods, horse, and 13 slaves.

Because William left four minor children the Inferior Court acted to appoint guardians. Those at least 12 years of age were allowed to pick their guardian: Edward chose Randolph Traylor, Mary chose John Banks, and Frances chose James Brooks. Because Milley was younger than 12 years the Court appointed James Brooks to be her guardian as well.

Final returns from this estate were located in the records of Oglethorpe County, because the land of William Traylor came into the newly formed county in 1794. Edward Traylor married Nov. 31, 1795 in Oglethorpe Co., Annice or Anny Banks, who died before 1820. Both Frances and Milley had married prior to 1801—Frances to Allen Spurlock, and Milley to Thomas Bannon. I have no record of Mary's marriage or death.

William Traylor, Jr., was much older than these children, and had married, probably in Virginia, Esther _____. He moved from Wilkes Co. early, and by 1809 is in old Randolph Co., renamed Jasper Co., Ga.

WILLIAM TRAYLOR, JR., b. 1760 in Dinwiddie Co. or Henrico Co. Va., m. about 1780 to ESTHER _____, and died about 1829 in Jasper Co., Ga. where his will is recorded. William, Jr., like his father, had served in the Revolution; his service was under Capt. Ralph Faulkner. Order of birth of William, Jr.'s children is not known: Migeman B. (executor)

Mary Anne, b. 3/14/1840, m. JOHN ELMORE MEADORS had 5 children, and d. 2/22/1901 in Claiborne Parish, Louisiana.

JOHN WESLEY TRAYLOR, son of John Traylor and Nancy Hales, b. 5/20/1823 in Jasper or Troup Co., Ga., m. 1/1/1852 in La. to ANGELINA FERRAND (b. 4/13/1834 in La., d. 3/30/1930 in La.) dau. of HYPOLITE FERRAND and EULALIE ETIER. John Wesley Traylor died 11/26/1871 in Caldwell Parish, La. They were the parents of:

WILEY H. TRAYLOR, b. 11/2/1796 in Wilkes or Oglethorpe Co., Ga., d. Troup Co., Ga., 8/20/1848. He moved to Troup Co. in 1825 with his brothers George Hamilton and John Traylor.

Wiley Traylor was active as a lay preacher in the Methodist church. He married twice. His first wife's name is not known. His second wife was MRS. ELIZABETH K. WALLER EVANS, a widow, b. Hancock Co., Ga., 5/28/1799. They were married 4/5/1838 and had two daughters:

Phillis Ann America, b. 2/12/1839, m. CHARLES C. MARCHMAN, and d. 1866

Rowannah Amanda, b. 5/30/1841 in Troup Co., m. at La Grange, Troup Co., Ga. 12/5/1860 to JAMES THOMAS JOHNSON, and d. 7/11/1885 at LaGrange.

MIGEMAN B. TRAYLOR, son of William Traylor, Jr. and Esther married in Randolph Co., Ala. and left children.

GEORGE HAMILTON TRAYLOR, son of William Traylor, Jr. and Esther, m. 5/1819 to CYNTHIA WILSON of Henry Co., Ga., lived in Pike Co., Ga. in 1822-1827, was in Troy Co., Ala. in 1827 and died in 1869. In 1850 his wife Cynthia "Synthe" was living, but a wife "ELIZABETH H. TRAYLOR" is mentioned in his will, signed 3/30/1869, probated on 4/16. Most of his children were by then deceased:

WILLIAM H. (or M.) TRAYLOR, son of William Traylor, Jr. and Esther, was dead in 1837, with guardians appointed for his minor children. His wife was apparently Sarah ____.

Eliza (Joseph H. Marsh gdn)

James L. (same gdn)

Thomas (same gdn); also listed as Thomas G.

William J. (Sarah Traylor gdn with Thos. J. Knight.

These records of administration are found in estate records of Jasper Co., Ga. from 1838 til 1853 when Thomas G. Traylor apparently came of age.

FROM FRANCE TO AMERICA—THE TRAYLOR TRAIL

A manuscript in the Virginia State Archives compiled by Lottie Williamson Hines in 1937 (filed by John Banister Chapter of the NSDAR of Petersburg) details the early history of the Traylor family.

Earliest records of the family have been abstracted from this source, while Georgia records have been seen either in the original within each county or on microfilm at the Ga. Department of Archives in Atlanta.

This presentation of the Traylor family was selected to help the searches of the following readers: Mrs. P. C. Lockett, 4624 Southern, Dallas, Texas 75209, descendant of WINN TRAYLOR, b. 3/7/1807 in Oglethorpe Co., Ga., connection yet unknown. His children bore names William, Pascal, Thomas, Henry and Randolph, all of which appear in the family line. Mr. Traylor Russell, Box 146, Mount Pleasant, Texas, great-grandson of DUNSTON TRAYLOR. Mrs. W. K. Pagel, Box 999, Beeville, Texas—also of WINN TRAYLOR line. Mrs. Sue Traylor Sturgeon, 3052 Silverton Dr., Dallas, Texas 75229—DUNSTON and TILMON TRAYLOR lines. Mrs. Leila Watson Ware, Woodbury, Ga. 30293 (whose Traylor query was recently printed)—ELIZABETH TRAYLOR, wife of REV. JAMES BROOKS of Oglethorpe Co., Ga.

EDOUARD TROILLEUR (later called EDWARD TRAYLOR) was son of EDOUARD TROILLEUR and his wife LOUISE PASCAL, was b. 5/7/1639 Nouseon, Ardennes, France, d. Henrico Co., Va. about 1677. Before coming to Virginia the family had lived in Hampton Parish, England, then crossed the Atlantic in 1662. Once in Virginia Edward Traylor was married to MARTHA RANDOLPH. Widow Martha Randolph Traylor m. secondly JOHN PORTER. In 1725 Martha R. T. Porter's will was recorded in Henrico Co., witnessed by JOHN TRAYLOR, and appointed son WILLIAM TRAYLOR as her sole executor. There was no mention in the will of son EDWARD TRAYLOR.

EDWARD² TRAYLOR, son of Edward Traylor and Martha Randolph, b. Henrico Co., Va., c. 1670, d. 1745-6, m. c. 1700 ELIZABETH PARKINSON, dau. SETH PARKINSON of Henrico Co. Edward made his will in presence of Peter Worsham, Jane and William Watkins 4/13/1745, mentioning bequests to wife ELIZABETH, daus. MARY TRAYLOR, PHEBY ELLIS, BLANCH TRAYLOR, and son WILLIAM TRAYLOR. Sole executor was to be THOMAS ELLIS (was he Pheby's husband?). Was Edward married twice? Bristol Parish Register records the birth of his children to mothers of different names: Phebe Traylor, b. 9/2/1725, bapt. 10/18/1733, and Blanch, b. 9/17/1732, bapt. 12/31/1832 were listed as daughters of ELIZABETH and Edmund Traylor; William Traylor, b. 9/2/1733, bapt. 10/21/1733, was

son of MARY and EDWARD TRAYLOR. (Bristol Parish Register, p. 373.

WILLIAM² TRAYLOR, son of Edward Traylor and Martha Randolph, b.c. 1674, d. Chesterfield Co., Va. 2/1753, m. in Henrico Co., Va. 10/5/1695 to JUDITH ARCHER, dau. GEORGE ARCHER and ELIZABETH HARRIS. Children of William² and Judith Traylor were: JOSEPH TRAYLOR, JOHN TRAYLOR and HUMPHREY TRAYLOR.

CONTEMPORARIES --were they all sons of EDWARD² TRAYLOR?

William, Thomas and Edward Traylor were residents of the same area of Virginia and lived at the same period. Indications point to their being sons of Edward² and Elizabeth Parkinson Traylor. THOMAS TRAYLOR was father of PASCAL TRAYLOR and CHAMPION TRAVIS TRAYLOR (b. 1770). EDWARD TRAYLOR left a will in Halifax Co., Va. in 1791.

WILLIAM³ TRAYLOR, son of Edward² Traylor, chose Robert Cousin as his guardian in 10/1754. By 1780 Williams appears in Dinwiddie Co., Va., then in Halifax Co., Va. He also served in the Revolution as private in Capt. Ralph Faulkner's Co., 5th Va. Regt. in 1776 and 1777. William married before coming to Ga. for his son William⁴ Traylor was born in Va., but the later children were born in Ga. --his wife's name is unknown. William Traylor died prior to 8/1791 in Wilkes Co., Ga., for his will was recorded in Will Book DD destroyed by fire in 1935. An abstract of this will shows children William, Jr.⁴, of age, Edward (12-21 years), Mary (12-21 yrs), Frances (12-21 yrs), and Milley (under 12 yrs). As a resident of Wilkes Co., Ga. land sales by William Traylor were recorded in Halifax Co., Va. --1787 to John Salmon (Deed Book 14, p. 178), and to William Bradshaw, with son William, Jr., and Thomas Traylor as witnesses. William Traylor received a grant of land on Long Creek which was cut off into Oglethorpe Co. in 1794, so the records of settlement of William Traylor's estate then appear in Oglethorpe records. The orphans of William³ Traylor chose their guardians if they were over 12 yrs but under 21 yrs, and young Edward chose RANDOLPH (sometimes called RANDAL) TRAYLOR for his guardian; Mary chose JOHN BANKS; and Frances chose JAMES BROOKS, while the justices of the court appointed James Brooks also as guardian for little Milley (under 12). REV. JAMES BROOKS was married³ to ELIZABETH TRAYLOR; was she an elder daughter of William³ Traylor? Frances Traylor m. Allen Spurlock, Milley m. Thomas Bannon, and Edward⁴ m. Annice (Annie, Anna) Banks 11/31/1795 in Oglethorpe Co. Annice Banks Traylor died between 1817 and 1820.

Detinue by Bryant Slaughter against William H. Cunningham for a slave named Mary JUL 14?

Plaintiff claimed title under a deed of gift from Champion T. Stallings to him as trustee, in trust for benefit of said grantor's daughter then living and named in deed and such other children as he might have by his then present wife whose maiden name was Mary L. Slaughter. This deed dated August 7, 1845 was executed while the grantor was a minor, and by him acknowledged in open court Fall Term of Circuit Court of Chambers.

Defendant first offered a transcript of records of Court of Ordinary for Jasper County, Georgia purporting to be copy of will of William Traylor, the grandfather of said Champion Stallings. Will contained the following clause: "Item. To my grandchildren, William J. Stallings and Champion T. Stallings, I give and bequeath a negro girl named Julia; also two cows and calves, bed and furniture, bedstead, chest and spinning wheel; all of said property to remain in the family until the youngest child, Champion T. Stallings becomes of age." Said will bears date 2 November 1826 and to have been proved in open court on 7 May 1827.

Witnesses: Green D. Brantley, Christopher Deadwilder, Paschal Traylor.

Defendant then introduced as a witness one Jeremiah Stallings father of said Champion, who testified that said Champion T. Stallings was born on 8th of March 1826; that trade took place in last of July or 1st of August 1847 just before said Champion left to join the U.S. Army in Mexico as a volunteer.
